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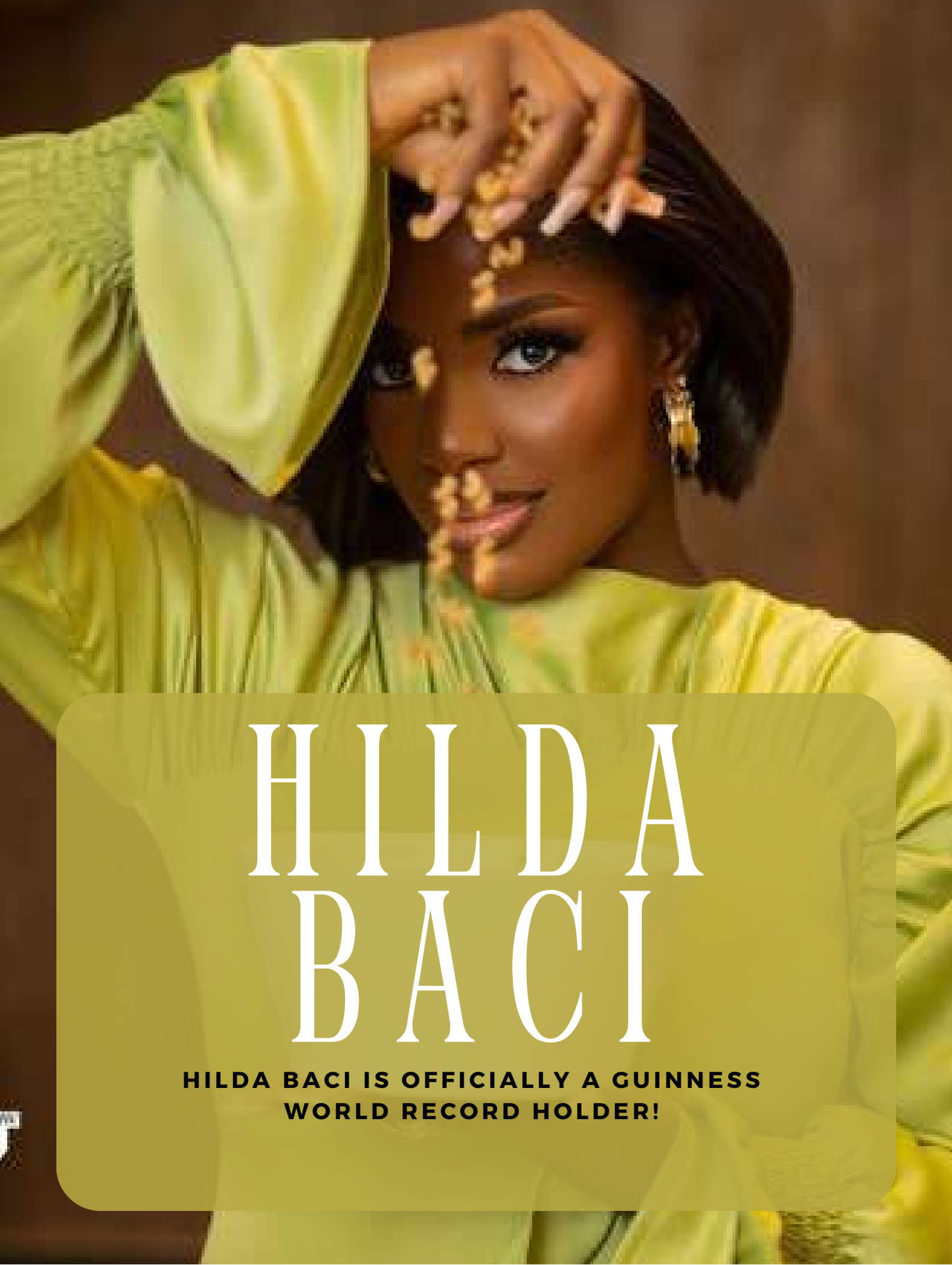
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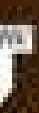
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HILDA BACI

**HILDA BACI IS OFFICIALLY A GUINNESS
WORLD RECORD HOLDER!**



Hilda Effiong Bassey (born 20 September 1996), better known as Hilda Baci, is a Nigerian chef, restaurateur, actress, and the current holder of the Guinness World Record for marathon cooking (Cook-athon) with 93 hours 11 minutes, setting a new record after surpassing Indian chef Lata Tondon 87 hours, 45 minutes cooking marathon in 2023.

Hilda was born on 20 September 1996, and she is from the Nsit Ubium Local Government Area of Akwa Ibom State.



Hilda broke the record for longest cooking marathon by any individual hitting 87 hours 50 minutes above the previous record holder in 2019.

Guinness World Records has officially confirmed that Nigerian chef and restaurateur Hilda Baci has broken the record for the longest cooking marathon (individual) with a time of 93 hours and 11 minutes.

"Almost seven hours were deducted from her final total because she mistakenly took extra minutes for one of her rest breaks early on in the attempt."

She graduated with a degree in sociology from Madonna University, located in Okija, Rivers State. She was the host of *Dine on a Budget*, a television show that airs on Pop Central TV.

Baci embarked on a culinary education program, drawing inspiration from her mother, a culinary chef.





EXCLUSIVE INTERVIEW WITH QUEEN STELLA OGERI DIKE MISS ENVIRONMENT NIGERIA 2022

Tell us about yourself?

My name is Stella Ogeri Dike. A native of Afikpo North Local government area of Ebonyi state. I'm the last child in a monogamous family of six.

I'm a law graduate and alumna of Ebonyi state university, an environmental protection advocate, a fashionpreneur, humanitarian, beauty queen and commercial model. I'm one person who is multifaceted and can fit into diverse roles perfectly.

As an endowed young intellectual. I seek to explore every potential nature has blessed with and as well those I deliberately cultivate through handwork and perseverance.

As a fashion enthusiast, I'm the creative director of the Lavidluxe Clothing brand, a Nigerian based Bespoke/ Ready to wear clothing and Leather Brand.

The founder of the R3 Green World Initiative, a non-governmental organization aimed at creating awareness on environmental protection using the Reuse, Reduce and Recycle techniques for a greener and healthier world free of plastics. My love for humanity has equally driven me to the path of humanitarian services, I currently run a Non-profit Foundation named after my late mum who bears same name as me, 'The Stella Dike Foundation'. SDF was officially launched on the 7th of January 2020, ever since then has taken on life changing projects and impactful campaigns. My life has revolved around fashion, beauty, wholistic entertainment, law and social causes relevant to the society.

How did your journey in pageantry begins?

As a young growing girl child I heard and read a lot about Agbani Darego. The first Nigerian and black woman to win Miss World. She is so phenomenal & a role model to aspiring beauty queens. Her journey inspired me and I thought to myself that one day I will grace an international stage like her, representing not just myself but as well my country. At that time, I didn't know how but I was just curious. An opportunity pop up during my undergraduate days and I grabbed it. There was this pageant that was on at that time, a national pageant but wasn't popular. I saw it as a training ground. I knew for me to plunge into the bigger ocean, I could start with a pool, to at least learn the basics. The pageant was an eye opener for me. I learned and unlearned a lot. A year later, I felt I was ready to give another national pageant a shot, this time around a bigger one.

Then, registration for Miss Tourism Nigeria pageant was on, it was a TV reality show and we were to be on screen for a month.uhh! That was it for me. I emerged Miss Environment Nigeria in the pageant to represent the country the following year in India.

What would you say stood you out from others?

I met so many wonderful and purpose driven ladies at the Miss Tourism Nigeria boot camp. We were all unique in diverse ways. All I did was let my personality shine.

I didn't need to be anyone else but me. Individuality will always be one of the conditions of real elegance.

What were the challenges you faced during the pageant and how you over came them?

I had an army behind me and that was all I needed. The cheer, the genuine love and unreserved support was everything to me. But, while in camp I started having allergies. My skin began to react to the water provided in camp. I learnt the environs was associated with bad water. The reaction was so much on my face that I looked like a monster each time I used the Mirror. The breakout was horrible and tried to mess with my confidence. It nearly took me away from most camp activities because it came with severe pain and itches.

The reigning queen then 'Queen Prisca Nwobodo, encouraged me. She told me not to give up regardless, in her words 'what will be will be no matter the challenges'. I got medications & an entirely new skincare kit from home. My family was & still my biggest support system.

My skincare routine became so intense because I needed to prep my face for the grand finale. I started using table water to wash my face instead of the normal camp water. I was able to heal before finale.



How was the bonding with other contestants?

Like I said earlier, I met so many incredibly amazing young women in camp so it was easy to bond with them. I had my camp buddies. It's common among pageant girls. Once, you get into camp, there are always this set of girls that you just click with. Tho, I'm not a clique person. I'm more of a lone ranger, but I really had close friends that turned sisters both at the Miss Tourism Nig. Pageant & Miss Environment Intl. We still keep tabs on each other till date.

Share with us your experience during the Miss Environment Intl. held in India.

This is an adventure that I would say is one of the most challenging I have faced. It came with so many hurdles. I was a first timer on the international platform. Everything was new to me. Trust me, international pageants are on a whole different level from what we do here in Nigeria.

In as much as i desired to venture into the international stage, I knew it would come with challenges but what I didn't know was how much of it. Firstly, I faced Visa issues. I had a delay getting an India visa because then Nigeria still had a covid 19 ban on entry visa. Before I could get my visa approved i was already late into the competition. I had missed the sashing ceremony, welcome dinner, prelims and other interesting camp activities that equally had it scores. I arrived India 3 days to the grand finale. I had a lot to do in camp to cover up for my absence. They had already gone far with rehearsals and preparations for the grand finale.

In all I made the best use of my 3 days, I created impact and India felt the presence of Nigeria. I knew I had lost my chances to the crown due to the circumstances aforementioned. But I gained the gift of humans who fell in love with me and my dear country Nigeria & can't wait to visit Nigeria because of me.



The experience was worthwhile because it opened doors of opportunities to me. I learned and unlearned during my journey. Real life lessons that could take me through life.

How have winning this pageant impacted your life?

It has aided my growth. I'm not where I used to be 2-3 years ago. I have a new perception about life generally. I have been able to usurp some of the opportunities the crown and sash presented me with, met amazing people around the world, visited interesting places, enjoyed cultures and cuisines, that has kept me informed...uhmm! Pageantry never leaves anyone the same. It helps you level up & being a beauty queen is a whole new level.

How does it feel representing your country?

The feeling is so surreal. It's a rare privilege to represent one's country on an international stage, a life time opportunity that I'm thankful for.

Has been a beauty Queen clashed with your personality?

I will say yes. I'm an ambivert. I have a balance of Extrovert and Introvert features in my personality. But as a beauty queen, you have to be more public than usual. A lot of social interactions and engagements. So you just have to fit in. After all, these are the responsibilities that comes with the crown. My extrovert features has to play out bigger. I have lived this life for quite some time now & I can say that I'm totally okay. Moving with the tide and having fun while at it.

What project have embarked on since you were crowned?

Firstly, I set up an initiative to help drive my environmental protection advocacy. We have a lot in the pipeline. My team & I have been able to reach out to important organizations to partner with us on this cause. Some of our works are not public yet but will soon get them out for the world to see what we have been up to and queue in.

In beauty pageantry did you have any mentors?

Yes, but I wish not to disclose them for some personal reasons. I have equally worked with pageant and life coaches of which the phenomenal Nma Nwokolo is one.

What does the sash & crown symbolize to you?

The crown and sash symbolizes strength. This is because the crown and sash comes with a lot of responsibilities. For you to emerge as a beauty queen, your strength and resilience must have been tested and you are found fit for the job. Also, the crown symbolizes royal honour. That means, you are a role model & a transformational leader that people can look up to at time. It is leadership and service through profound strength and honour.

What is your vision for the society and what impact have you made?

I dream of a society where there is social development and social inclusion. Equal opportunity for all irrespective of social background, religion, tribal difference etc. A society where destitute children can have same opportunity and privileges as kids from a wealthy background. This has led to the establishment of my foundation 'SDF'. I will contribute my quota to the society through this platform & I'm hopeful that many other well meaning Nigerians will take on this cause. Environmental protection is also a cause dear to my heart & relevant to the society. Environmental degradation has grave health implications.

The planet is currently struggling to keep up with our increased demand for natural resources which are grossly affected by climate change (global warming). The planet is in danger, joining voices with the UN in fulfilling the objectives of SDG 13 is a step in the right direction. The R3 Green World Initiative is a channel i intend to use to drive my advocacy and I have decided to work with like minded individuals and organizations on this cause beginning from my country Nigeria through campaigns & Eco-friendly projects.

How do you relax as you are quite busy with engagements?

Mostly, I have weekends to myself except when on vacation. I unwind with a good book at home, watch documentaries or go to the beach or a resort. I love nature a lot. So, inhaling sea breeze and soaking in the sun helps me get rid of stress.

Who is your ideal life partner?

(Smiles). A positively confident man, who is respectful and sensitive to me. Goal-orientated, God fearing, hardworking and intelligent. He has to possess an irresistible masculine charm & a sense of responsibility.

INTERVIEWING TIPS FOR A MODELING CAREER.

Working through an agency is the most common way for a model to get work. Doing well in a modeling interview is key to getting your foot in the door. Whether you were contacted by the agency or are going in on your own accord, you need to present yourself in the best light to make a lasting impression. This means you'll have to rely on more than just your good looks to ace the interview. Prepare with our interviewing tips for a modeling career!

Do Your Research

Research the agency, so you know what kind of models they represent as well as what their body style, portfolio, and other requirements are. This ensures you fit the criteria and are well-prepared for the interview. Many agencies put this information on their website, but you can also call them.

Prepare a Portfolio

A portfolio is one of the most effective tools an aspiring model has. Agencies may specify the number and type of photos you need to have in your portfolio. The minimum is generally one portrait photo and one in upright body position. You can also include simple poses such as sitting, profile and looking over your shoulder. You usually don't have to smile, but you may wish to have some pictures with varying facial expressions to show versatility. The clothing you wear should be tight-fitting, such as swimwear, tank tops, and skinny jeans. Do not wear any make-up in the shots, as the agency needs to see how you look completely natural.

Prepare a Resume

This document provides the interviewer with the most pertinent information about you at-a-glance. It contains information on your past modeling work, any training as an actor or any awards. Also a list of shows or publications you've appeared in, as well as any educational background you have in fashion or a related field. You can also include your body measurements, including height, weight, bust, waist, hips, inseam, dress size and shoe size. Some agencies though require you to put this information in a separate document called a "comp card".

Take Care of Your Appearance

Your hair, nails, and skin must be clean, neat and free of blemishes. You will want to look as natural as possible, so use a sparing amount of make-up. This may include a little bit of foundation, mascara, eye shadow, and lip gloss.

Practice Modeling

The interviewer will assess how well you pose and walk, so practice beforehand to make sure you've at least got the basics down. Watch videos and look in magazines to get ideas for poses, facial expressions and how to walk a runway. Try things out in a mirror to make sure it looks good, then ask family members and friends to watch and give you some pointers. Practice maintaining your composure in any situation.

Think of Answers to Common Questions

Modeling interviews usually involve some standard questions. These most often include questions about how long you've been modeling, any especially notable shows or publications you've appeared in. It may also be about the type of modeling you want to do (e.g. commercial, fashion, etc.), and why you want to work with that particular agency.

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7 STYLING TIPS FOR CURVE MODELS

2. Define your waist

Cinching waists helps to project a slimmer waistline and provides an hourglass figure. It is recommended to wear high waist belts for shorter people, as it will elongate their overall appearances and make their legs look longer. Tuck the belts with loose fitted fabric to avoid the “bulging effect”. Avoid wearing thick belts as it can bring attention to the width of a person, which completely defeats the purpose of the cinched effect.

3. Avoid rounded toe shoes

Often rounded shoes can have the impact of making anyone look shorter. A look overall can be elongated by wearing pointed or open toe shoes. This will make the legs look longer and well-balanced.

4. Utilise strategic Patterns


Patterns can be a tricky matter when it comes to balancing an overall look. Bold coloured, thick patterns can give the impression of a different body size and can bring attention to the wrong body parts. Whereas, smaller and darker coloured patterns can complement the style and the form. For example, smaller polka dots can make the figure look a lot more flattering than bigger ones.

5. V Necks are the Best

V neck tops can elongate the appearance of the waist. V neck tops can help direct focus from any problematic area to the bust area. This can also make the look more feminine and playful.

6. High Waist Bottoms compliment anyone's figure!

High waisted pants or skirts with pointed or open-toe shoes are often great pairs that elongate the look, beautifully. To complete the look, wear a semi-fitted top which ends on the waistline if not slightly under.



With the modelling industry adapting and changing every day, the demand for curve models is increasing. The “body positivity” movement has prompted agencies and industry to start to embrace bodies of all shapes and sizes. Therefore, everyone has a chance to celebrate their bodies, both in and out of the industry!
