


EDITOR'S Letter

In fact, it's highly situational, but your best chance is to use vitamin C serum and niacinamide serum formulated to be used together. L'Oréal Paris recommends using L'Oréal Paris Revitalift Derm Intensives 12% Pure Vitamin C + E + Salicylic Acid Serum and L'Oréal Paris Bright Reveal 12% [Niacinamide + Amino Sulfonic + Ferulic Acid] Dark Spot Serum in the same routine to target dullness and dark spots. This way, you can confidently use both in the same regimen because the brand has formulated them with the intention to pair if needed.

I was in the church's drama unit and choir and was always given a major role along side decorating the church with my mum.

It just didn't end in church activities, I was a social bee both in my primary and secondary school leading the school dance and drama team for every end of the year party. Art has been an integral part of my life and choosing a career part in it wasn't a difficult one at all. Studying theatre arts at the university brought a meeting point to all of my talents and it fashioned the birth of prince glam empire. Ps I was also a pageant king in my first year in school (MR FACULTY OF ARTS UNN 2017). Right after my pageant I watched YouTube videos on makeup and started practicing while designing that same year pageant student on costumes for campus and outside my university. So far it has been an amazing 6 years of professionally designing different national and international costumes, beauty makeup, special effect makeup, film costume design and overall beauty consultancy. Bagging over 15 awards nationally, the brand has grown rapidly and I am excited for all that is to come.

WHAT INSPIRED YOU BECOMING A FASHION STYLIST?

Honestly, I grew up in a very fashionable home. My mum would always handle the beautification of our local church and choir uniforms by herself while my dad on the other hand sold clothes at Lagos island while we were growing up. His combinations every Sunday to church was always a turn head style and this influenced i and my brothers sense of fashion. Having this amazing background further reflected on my personal style growing up. found myself recommending looks for my friends cos I was always updated with the latest in Fast forward to after town. mv competition in school and winning the faculty most handsome tittle, I had students who wanted to pay me to fix up their look for their pageants and birthday shoot along side rendering makeup services and this gave birth to all the styling services we offer today across all fashion spaces.

HOW DO YOU DETERMINE A CLIENT'S PERSONAL STYLE?

There is always a consultation stage. Here I get to listen to the clients needs. Most times they come without a clue of what they want and it is my duty to present trendy and recent designs to them while we both make the final decision of what the final look should be. On the other hand, some of my clients already have their desired designs in mind, it's left for me to modify or advice them on their take looking at their body structures and event in view. At the end of the day, they are carried along every step of the way till the final result is achieved. My styling services isn't just the clothing alone, I creatively decide hair, makeup, accessories, photography. No part of the creative process in achieving these looks is left behind cos it has to be an ensemble.

CAN YOU DESCRIBE YOUR STYLE AND HOW IT INFLUENCES YOUR WORK AS A FASHION STYLIST?

Well, my personal style most times comes from my mood and what event is in view. Personally i have always loved bright , silky , simple plain and pattern fabrics and design. All of these is on a personal note but when it comes to Princeglam styling, I am often referred to as the "Drama". This is so because I love to always want to make a remembered statement look . Take my costumes for instance, they are well detailed and this creates a long lasting mental picture. I think far away from the norm cos that's one beautiful secret to standing out. So generally, my style is bold, edgy , colorful and sensational (I love it sexy too).

WHAT IS THE MOST IMPORTANT THING FOR YOU WHEN STYLING A MODEL?

The most important thing for me when styling a model most times is creative freedom while working for a model or client. Having a vast experience and knowledge about styling enables me to see beyound just the now in every piece. Most time, these models wants to pick up an identity or rather look like someone else when their body doesn't give the same fitting or proportion. At this junction it is my soul duty as the stylist to give a candid creative advice and look for befitting alternatives to make the piece come alive, adequately highlighting all that is needed.

ARE THERE ANY SPECIFIC FASHION DESIGNERS OR STYLISTS, WHO HAVE SIGNIFICANTLY IMPACTED YOUR WORK AND STYLE?

Yes most definitely but top on the list is my late boss who I learned under, Henry OKONKWO. He was one of Nigerian finest exports in traditional and creative costumes and really drilled me in becoming who I am today. Love you Biggy. Moving on, Millicent jack and Adeola Ogunjobi have both been a big inspiration when it comes to styling for movies because I've worked with them on big productions like blood vessel and Hijack respectively and these woman really understand the styling job like the back of their palm. On a General note, I pick inspiration from any work of art I encounter because no man is an island. We create to keep inspiring directly or indirectly.





Honestly, the Goal has been to create timeless fashion pieces that will stand the taste of time and gradually I am equipping myself to get to that point. Also, I want to be able to win international best national costume design from my empire exalting our cultural root and identity. The goal is to make both national and global impact through my craft, inspiring others believing in their own craft when they look at me and hear my story. For now, one of my major projects I'm view is proper archiving of these national costumes at a very big museum in Nigeria because come rain come shine, it is history made and needs to be preserved. So I'll be working with a ministry of culture and tourism in the country to see that this is done very soon.



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INTERVIEWING TIPS FOR A MODELING CAREER.

Working through an agency is the most common way for a model to get work. Doing well in a modeling interview is key to getting your foot in the door. Whether you were contacted by the agency or are going in on your own accord, you need to present yourself in the best light to make a lasting impression. This means you'll have to rely on more than just your good looks to ace the interview. Prepare with our interviewing tips for a modeling career!

Do Your Research

Research the agency, so you know what kind of models they represent as well as what their body style, portfolio, and other requirements are. This ensures you fit the criteria and are well-prepared for the interview. Many agencies put this information on their website, but you can also call them.

Prepare a Portfolio

A portfolio is one of the most effective tools an aspiring model has. Agencies may specify the number and type of photos you need to have in your portfolio. The minimum is generally one portrait photo and one in upright body position You can also include simple poses such as sitting, profile and looking over your shoulder. You usually don't have to smile, but you may wish to have some pictures with varying facial expressions to show versatility. The clothing you wear should be tight-fitting, such as swimwear, tank tops, and skinny jeans. Do not wear any make-up in the shots, as the agency needs to see how you look completely natural.

Prepare a Resume

This document provides the interviewer with the most pertinent information about you at-a-glance. It contains information on your past modeling work, any training as an actor or any awards. Also a list of shows or publications you've appeared in, as well as any educational background you have in fashion or a related field. You can also include your body measurements, including height, weight, bust, waist, hips, inseam, dress size and shoe size. Some agencies though require you to put this information in a separate document called a "comp card".

Take Care of Your Appearance

Your hair, nails, and skin must be clean, neat and free of blemishes. You will want to look as natural as possible, so use a sparing amount of make-up. This may include a little bit of foundation, mascara, eye shadow, and lip gloss.

Practice Modeling

The interviewer will assess how well you pose and walk, so practice beforehand to make sure you've at least got the basics down. Watch videos and look in magazines to get ideas for poses, facial expressions and how to walk a runway. Try things out in a mirror to make sure it looks good, then ask family members and friends to watch and give you some pointers. Practice maintaining your composure in any situation.

Think of Answers to Common Questions

Modeling interviews usually involve some standard questions. These most often include questions about how long you've been modeling, any especially notable shows or publications you've appeared in. It may also be about the type of modeling you want to do (e.g. commercial, fashion, etc.), and why you want to work with that particular agency.

1. Ensure you get your sizing right

It is important to wear the "right size" clothing. Try avoiding wearing sizes that are too small for the body, as it accentuates the wrong areas. On the other hand, wearing loose clothes can make you give a wrong impression of your overall body structure and sizing. The better the sizing, the more flattering it looks. That being said, when shopping feel free to try out different sizes of clothes, as a lot of brands are known to have different clothing sizes under the universal size numbers.

2. Define your waist

Cinching waists helps to project a slimmer waistline and provides an hourglass figure. It is recommended to wear high waist belts for shorter people, as it will elongate their overall appearances and make their legs look longer. Tuck the belts with loose fitted fabric to avoid the "bulging effect". Avoid wearing thick belts as it can bring attention to the width of a person, which completely defeats the purpose of the cinched effect.

3. Avoid rounded toe shoes

Often rounded shoes can have the impact of making anyone look shorter. A look overall can be elongated by wearing pointed or open toe shoes. This will make the legs look longer and wellbalanced.

4. Utilise strategic Patterns

Patterns can be a tricky matter when it comes to balancing an overall look. Bold coloured, thick patterns can give the impression of a different body size and can bring attention to the wrong body parts. Whereas, smaller and darker coloured patterns can complement the style and the form. For example, smaller polka dots can make the figure look a lot more flattering than bigger ones.

5. V Necks are the Best

V neck tops can elongate the appearance of the waist. V neck tops can help direct focus from any problematic area to the bust area. This can also make the look more feminine and playful.

6. High Waist Bottoms compliment anyone's figure!

High waisted pants or skirts with pointed or opentoe shoes are often great pairs that elongate the look, beautifully. To complete the look, wear a semifitted top which ends on the waistline if not slightly under.

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
